Lighting Up the Audit

John 3:19 (ESV)

And this is the judgment: the light has come into the world, and people loved the darkness rather than the light because their works were evil.

1 Corinthians 4:5 (ESV)

Therefore do not pronounce judgment before the time, before the Lord comes, who will bring to light the things now hidden in darkness and will disclose the purposes of the heart. Then each one will receive his commendation from God.

The Bible clearly speaks of the great conflict between darkness and light (that is, wrong vs. right). Light always wins over the darkness, even a small amount of light. But have you noticed how we try to cover our ungodly deeds in darkness? How many leaders have promised transparency only to hide in the dark?

Bipartisan groups of people are engaged in auditing the recent Presidential election to see if it was an honest election. Likewise, bipartisan groups are resisting the audit. Why? If the election was honest, won't the audit show it? Or, are we trying to hide some underhanded scheme?

When the one who presumably won the election bragged beforehand that there would be voter fraud, should we not look into it? On October 24, 2020 Candidate Joe Biden announced:
