Then McHenry added: "The Lady here alluded to was Mrs. Powel of Philada."

- "Corrupt or incompetent men will be appointed to execute the laws; the public revenues will be squandered on unworthy men; and the rights of the citizens will be violated or disregarded."
- "If a republican government fails to secure public prosperity and happiness, it must be because the citizens neglect the divine commands, and elect bad men to make and administer the laws."

Americans have been lazy about elections. Some feel like voting is not essential to our nation. One particular group of Americans that have dropped the voting ball is Christian Americans. This group could change the nation's course if they would get out from their televisions and vote on election days. Too, too many don't think it's important. Maybe it's bad theology. Maybe it is just plain laziness. Some vote but pay little attention to the candidates.
